# **United Presidents of SUN (UPSUN) Workshop**

[This UPSUN report is prepared by Prof. Ronald Steiner]

 The UPSUN Workshop is a significant segment of the General Assembly. The objective of the UPSUN workshop is to gather innovative ideas from the university leaders, facilitate collaboration among the member universities, and learn from each other to make the

curriculum and campus trendy.

• At the 9th General Assembly UPSUN workshop, held at the prestigious Palazzo Du Mesnil, a lively and in-depth discussion unfolded. High-level representatives, including presidents, rectors, and professors from member universities, gathered to address the multifaceted challenges and opportunities within higher education along the Silk Road. The participants engaged in a productive dialogue, exploring potential avenues for collaboration and partnership.

The following member universities were represented in the UPSUN workshop and introduced their university's programs and activities:

#### Various Proposals and considerations discussed

The University of Bucharest(UB) proposed adjustments to the speech and debate contest. The idea would be to combine UBs alignment with civis. EU and its blended intensive programs to supplement the speech and debate contest with online teaching blended with short-term, face-to-face study to increase student learning and engagement

Ca Foscari University and others remarked on their commitment to interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research and finding ways to promote research that is attentive to cultural diversity in the spirit of SUN, and to have member universities advance, practical levels of interaction among the actual hands-on researchers

The University of Delhi hoped to see SUN increase as a catalyst for a broader exchange of knowledge, especially through the proposed forums which can carry on the work regularly throughout the year and not just at periodic annual meetings

It was suggested that SUN sponsor perhaps with UDG a program of sports festivals involving a cooperative model of competition to inspire student interaction.



It was proposed that SUN may seek collaborations with UNICA, which is a consortium of major universities in European capital cities fostering research in public policy and urban affairs.

This might be connected to a proposal to advance physicians as disciples of Hippocrates, including an annual conference on Kos Island, the home of Hippocrates, to focus on medical ethics and contribute to preserving the Hippocratic site itself.

It was proposed that the SUN might create its own ranking system to systematically evaluate schools based on metrics defined in ways that advance the mission of SUN and address some of the long standing and common critiques of the existing ranking systems.

Finally, the University of social scientist and humanities of Vietnam national University and others hoped to promote increased engagement by students in the various competitions and in other ways, increasing student and community involvement, especially encouraging students to create networks on their own using social media and other resources

In general, UPSUN participants sensed that SUN has reached an inflection point and must proceed to a higher level of demonstrated achievement of value to member institutions.

# **USSUN** Workshop

[Report from Professor Dorota Sylwia Majewicz, USSUN adviser]







On November 14, 2024, during the 9th General Assembly of the United Students of the Silk-Road Universities Network (USSUN) held in Naples, Italy, Professor Dorota Sylwia Majewicz chaired the USSUN workshop. The assembly served as a platform for academic and cultural exchange among member institutions, advancing the objectives of the Silk Road Universities Network.

#### **Key Workshop Themes and Proposals:**

The workshop commenced with participant introductions, wherein students presented their academic backgrounds and affiliated universities, fostering a collegial atmosphere. A video address by the 2023–2024 USSUN Secretary-General, Rasoul Firouzi (Allameh Tabataba'i University, Iran) was followed by the presentation made by Coordinators of SUN, highlighting the network's achievements and aspirations. Subsequently, elections for the new USSUN leadership took place.

The elected officials are USSUN Secretary-General Elia Pizzato (Ca' Foscari University of Venice, Italy), USSUN President Maria Pourlioti (Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece), and Vice President Muhayyo Odilxojayeva (Uzbek State University of World languages, Uzbekistan). The new leadership emphasized inclusivity, collaboration, and innovation in their vision for the network.

Under Professor Majewicz's guidance, the workshop addressed critical topics to enhance USSUN's functionality and visibility. A primary concern was the need for improved recognition and accessibility of USSUN activities across member universities. Participants advocated for better integration of USSUN information on institutional websites to facilitate faculty and student engagement, thereby increasing participation in events such as the SUN General Assembly. Regular communication and comprehensive announcements were deemed essential for effective outreach.

The limited representation at General Assembly meetings was another significant issue. Increasing the number of representatives was seen as beneficial for enriching the diversity of perspectives essential for informed decision-making, enhancing the visibility of smaller or less-represented institutions, and expanding networking opportunities. Participants emphasized that greater representation would strengthen relationships among member universities.

The workshop also highlighted the importance of establishing student exchange programs among member universities. Such initiatives were recognized as valuable for fostering cultural understanding and offering unique academic and personal development opportunities. Additionally, the idea of international research collaborations, supported by SUN and USSUN Advisors, was proposed to connect students across borders on shared academic challenges.

The need for mentorship programs tailored to student needs was underscored. These programs, involving experienced academics and professionals, would provide guidance and skill development, empowering students to navigate academic and professional pathways effectively. Furthermore, creating cross-cultural bridges to support and expand student activities was discussed, promoting greater collaboration and mutual understanding within the network. Participants stressed the importance of inclusivity and improved communication within USSUN, advocating for better visibility of SUN on member university websites to facilitate access to events and initiatives.

#### **Strategic Recommendations:**

The workshop concluded with several strategic recommendations. Foremost was the call for more effective promotion of USSUN activities to enhance visibility and accessibility. Participants underscored the need to improve inclusivity and communication within the network and to ensure that USSUN's mission and events are prominently featured on member university websites, providing a centralized resource for information.

Prioritizing increased representation at General Assemblies was deemed essential for equitable participation and enriched dialogue. Expanding exchange programs and establishing mentorship initiatives were identified as practical strategies to foster academic growth and cultural exchange, aligning with USSUN's overarching goals of addressing global challenges collaboratively. These programs would also serve as mechanisms to enhance the cross-cultural competencies of students.

#### **Conclusion:**

The workshop, chaired by Professor Majewicz, was instrumental in shaping the future direction of USSUN. Through thoughtful dialogue and innovative proposals, participants outlined a vision for enhancing USSUN's impact by prioritizing inclusivity, strengthening communication, and boosting cross-cultural collaboration. These efforts position USSUN to achieve its mission of promoting academic excellence and mutual understanding among its members. The outcomes of this workshop underscore the network's potential to drive meaningful change and establish a robust foundation for future endeavors.




